

JEREMIAH SPORTSMEN'S THIRD ANNUAL DUCK HUNT

Schedule:

Leave 1:00pm January 8th (will coordinate transportation near the actual date)

Thursday night: Lodge Reception and Dinner/Program

Friday: Morning hunt, afternoon fun, evening dinner/program

Saturday: Morning hunt, return in afternoon

About the Lodge/Hunt:

3,000 acres of land to hunt including the Cache River System. Various hunting conditions for duck and geese. Pit blinds, ground blinds, flooded timber and fields.. Deluxe lodge facility has several amenities including a shower room with a changing area and storage compartments in every room, and an in house kitchen. The lodge provides a comfortable area to kick back and relax after hunting. The fully enclosed back deck allows a view of our 160 acre rest area where the majority of ducks are located. In addition the social area, big screen TV, in house casino, foosball tables, bumper pool, and Jacuzzi suites provide luxury and entertainment for a total hunt experience <http://www.arrowheadhuntingclub.com/index.html>

About the Hunt:

Guided hunt: 1 guide for every 4 to 5 hunters.

Hunt on 2500 acres of flooded farm land and trees

Lodge is on the edge of water. Walk on the front door to boat duck and off to the blinds.

Costs:

Costs is \$250 for the hunt, lodging and food. Not included: transportation, tips for guides (usually \$10 to \$20), small cleaning fee for ducks (usually \$3 to \$4 per duck)

Deposit: \$125 by Sept 1st to reserve spot. Will develop waiting list for exchanges.

After December 1st NO REFUNDS as commitment must be made.

Registration: Immediately to determine the initial number of hunters. Do not send money now just email or call Dave Iverson – david.iverson@jeremiahsportsmen.com (309) 287-2936

What to Bring:

Warm clothes, suggest brown camo clothing and rain gear, waders. Shotgun, typically 12 or 10 gauge plugged to a three-shell capacity, shotgun shells (50 rounds per each hunter) loaded with steel shot (bismuth-tin and tungsten-iron are also approved), and ear plugs (lodge is next to train tracks and if they are running can be noisy).
